The need for a shower initiated this bathroom remodel. This primary bathroom from the eighties had a tub with a handheld faucet for bathing, but no shower. By removing the old tub and shower, accenting with a rich opalescent glass mosaic tile that extending the shower enclosure into the bathroom we were able to give these homeowners a spacious walk-in shower. The vanity was extended by removing the linen closet in the corner, with the sinks now separated by a countertop cabinet for

storage. The bright white vanity and bench are topped with taupe and white quartz countertops. We were indulgent in the runs floor to ceiling filing the corner and the niche. The corner bench is perfect to sit and bathe with the handheld faucet. The hush of the blue walls calms the beautiful space sparkled with gold touches throughout.

This 1956 Edina kitchen was cramped and not very functional. In 1993, an addition was added, that included a Dining and Family Room. There were two entries into these rooms, which took up valuable wall space. The kitchen lacked storage, countertop space and needed new appliances. An underused dining room next to the Kitchen in the original home was incorporated into the remodel to create a larger cohesive



space. Walls were removed, a larger window added, one entryway to the addition was eliminated and a large breakfast bar pass-through that connects the kitchen went into the dining and family room. Professional grade Subzero/Wolf appliances, wood flooring, white inset Crystal Cabinets and Cambria quartz countertops turned this dated kitchen into a culinary delight for the homeowners. Hosting large family gatherings is now more enjoyable and allows them to set up buffet style dinners.

These homeowners love to entertain. A single oven, speed oven, gas range with griddle and refrigerator accommodate hosting large family gatherings and parties. A pull-out spice rack and a utensil holder flank both sides of the range and a pull-out trash and recycling cabinet is housed on the island.

A custom Vent-A-Hood range hood has a mix of polished and brushed stainless. The new island is topped with Cambria Quartz countertops that flow down both sides of the island in a waterfall application.

A new linear gas fireplace and wood mantel are surrounded with silver leaf travertine tile echoing the mixed metals in the kitchen. The mix of gold and silver metals throughout the design feels modern and intentional, and is a nice deviation from the matchy-matchy designs you see in most new construction.

The kitchen was not functioning. It needed larger walking isles, an island that included seating and the homeowners wanted to improve the sight lines to the dining and living room. CK+B Designer, Chenelle worked to create a high functioning kitchen that is easy to clean, with higher end appliances and plenty of hidden storage for multiple small appliances, cookware, and gadgets. She also opted to move the cooktop from the crowded island. By removing some of the wall and base cabinets, more space was created around the island and into the kitchen from the nearby spaces to make it feel more open.

They selected a strong horizontal grain cabinet with geometric glass doors and a geometric backsplash. The modern design flows seamlessly with the midcentury style of the rest of the home. The retired homeowners now use the space to prepare and enjoy meals in their new dream kitchen.
