



SERENE & LUXURIOUS PRIMARY BATHROOM / EDINA

This primary bathroom was outdated and in need of a facelift. The homeowners wanted to completely renovate all the finishes and fixtures to create a luxurious feeling space.

From the expanded vanity with wall sconces on each side of the gracefully curved mirrors to the plumbing fixtures that are minimalistic in style with their fluid lines, this bathroom is one you want to spend time in.

Adding a sculptural free-standing tub with soft curves and elegant proportions enhanced the design

of the bathroom. Heated floors keep the tiled floors warm and cozy.

To add interest, white Carrara marble tile is used throughout the bathroom in different tile sizes and organic shapes. Crown molding was added in the tray ceiling to define this architectural element and a crystal chandelier adds sparkle to the room.

The marble tile and soothing color palette mixed with exquisite plumbing fixtures elevated the look of this primary bathroom to a space that is serene and luxurious to be in.

ARTISTIC BATHROOM / ST. PAUL

The bathroom had good bones but was lacking light, had a weird industrial metal insert in the wall, and had a one-piece stainless-steel shower insert that was dangerously slippery. In the bathroom, we replaced the mirror with a unique hexagon shape that echoes the gradient hexagon encaustic tile in the shower. A new penny round shower floor was installed for extra traction and frameless glass shower door was added to keep the bathroom bright and open. An accent of stainless-steel corner shelves in the shower add function without distracting from the great pattern. Giving new life to the existing distressed vanity cabinet, the new Cambria Quartz countertop matches the kitchen countertops.

This loft now matches the artistic vibes of the building, the personality of the homeowner, and imparts the quality this homeowner deserves so she can enjoy it for many years to come.



ARTISTIC KITCHEN / ST. PAUL

This condo was recently updated but the quality and layout were not great. The sink was stuck in the corner and the refrigerator was tiny. The homeowner desired an open kitchen with a good layout, plenty of storage, ample countertops, and seating for entertaining. We got rid of the freestanding kitchen island and reconfigured the kitchen into a U-shaped layout with a huge peninsula. The new full-size refrigerator was relocated to the adjacent wall, the sink was moved out of the corner and the range was moved to the new peninsula. This gives the kitchen a great work triangle that is ideal for entertaining. This loft now matches the artistic vibes of the building, the personality of the homeowner, and imparts the quality this homeowner deserves so she can enjoy it for many years to come.

MODERN OPULENCE PRIMARY BATH / PLYMOUTH

By removing the old tub and extending the shower enclosure into the bathroom we were able to give these homeowners a spacious walk-in shower. The vanity was extended by removing the linen closet in the corner. Now the sinks are separated by a countertop cabinet for storage. The bright white vanity and bench are topped with taupe and white quartz countertops. We were indulgent in the shower accenting with a rich opalescent glass mosaic tile that runs floor to ceiling filling the corner and the niche. The corner bench is perfect to sit and bathe with the handheld faucet. The hush of the blue walls calm the beautiful space sparkled with gold touches.



BOLD LAUNDRY ROOM REMODEL / MAPLE GROVE

By removing a shallow depth pantry closet in the Kitchen, we gained square footage in the Laundry Room to add a bench for setting backpacks on and cabinetry above for storage of outerwear. Coat hooks make hanging jackets and coats up easy for the kids. Luxury vinyl flooring that looks like tile was installed for its durability and comfort to stand on.

On the opposite wall, a countertop was installed over the washer and dryer for folding clothes, but it also comes in handy when the family is entertaining, since it's adjacent to the Kitchen. A tall cabinet and floating shelf above the washer and dryer add additional storage and completes the look of the room. A pocket door replaces a swinging door that hindered traffic flow through this room to the garage, which is their primary entry into the home.



SIMPLY BEAUTIFUL BATHROOM REMODEL / TONKA BAY

This spacious bathroom was dated and had a cold cave like shower. The homeowner desired a beautiful space with a European feel, like the ones she discovered on her travels to Europe. She also wanted a privacy door separating the bathroom from her bedroom. The designer opened up the closed off shower by removing the soffit and dark cabinet next to the shower to add glass and let light in. Now the entire room is bright and airy with marble look porcelain tile throughout. The archway was added to frame in the under-mount tub. The double vanity in a soft gray paint and topped with Corian Quartz compliments the marble tile. The new chandelier along with the chrome fixtures add just the right amount of luxury to the room. Now when you come in from the bedroom you are enticed to come in and stay a while in this beautiful space.



BOLD HALF BATH REMODEL / MAPLE GROVE

The bold paint color adds drama to the room and the metallic wallpaper really makes this bathroom pop! A mixture of metal finishes and the crisp white vanity add a clean look to the Half Bathroom. Hickory wood flooring was added and runs throughout the main floor of the home.



CAPTIVATING VIBRANCE KITCHEN REMODEL / GOLDEN VALLEY

The homeowners, a pilot and teacher, came with a desire to brighten their dark dated kitchen. The peninsula cut off the kitchen from the rest of the house. By redesigning the space with a large island, the kitchen now flows into the living room. The enlarged window moved closer to the corner for the 48" Wolf range and stately hood. The sink moved to the island with ample storage and seating for six. The pantry closet became an open bar with floating shelves, storage, and wine refrigerator. The bright white and cheerful blue cabinets lighten the room. The floating shelves and mantle complement the wood flooring. Now the entire room flows with functionality and is an amazingly beautiful space to cook masterpieces and spend time with friends and family.



FRESH ESCAPE PRIMARY BATHROOM / PLYMOUTH

A new room layout created a more functional space, with a separated space for the toilet and added privacy with a cabinet and custom hanging pipe shelf. By adding a double sink vanity, we gained valuable floor space to still have a soaking tub and larger shower. In-floor heat keeps the room cozy and warm all year long. The entry door was replaced with a pocket door to keep the area in front of the vanity unobstructed. The cabinet next to the toilet has sliding doors and adds storage for towels and toiletries and the vanity has a pull-out hair station.

Rich, walnut cabinetry is accented nicely with the soft, blue/green color palette of the tiles and wall color. Handcrafted swirl pendants illuminate the vanity and are made from 100% recycled glass.
